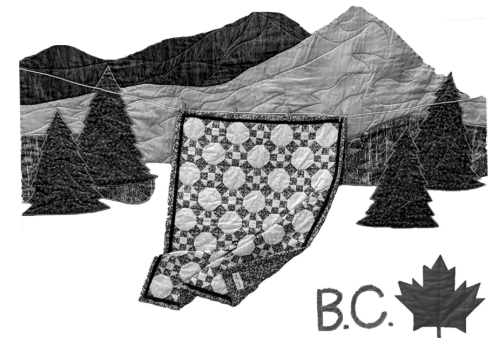

MEETINGS

Guild meetings are held September to June on the 2nd Tuesday of the Month 6 pm to 9 pm

In person meetings are hosted September to December and March to June.

The winter months of January and February are hosted via ZOOM (saving us from having to commute in the dark and dreary weather).

May is the Annual General Meeting. July and August are unstructured months with the Guild meeting socially in local area parks.

Information and Agendas are forwarded to the Membership in advance of all meetings. We start with a business meeting, followed by a Program event, some socializing and Show 'n Tell.

RMQG SHOW

Quilt shows are exciting opportunities to showcase the Guilds' talents and open the doors to the world. Shows are held when possible.

RAFFLE QUILT

Annually the RMQG creates a special quilt specifically for either donation or raffle. Donations are offered to a local service organization, which they use as a fundraiser. Previous recipients have been RM SAR, and MR/PM Community Service.

WORKSHOPS

The Program Committee plans events for each Meeting. Members participate in various workshops, presentations, challenges, guest speakers and even shopping nights.

ZOOM Sit and Stitch

On select Wednesdays and Saturdays our Zoom host offers Sit and Sew. You can set up in your own sewing space, visit and chat with other members all in the comfort of home.

SEW DAYS

For a small price to cover facility costs – members get together at various locations to stitch. The 2nd Thursday and a selected Saturday once per month. Machine and Hand work are all welcome. Locations and dates provided at meetings or in the newsletter.

GUILD RETREAT

All Members are invited to the Annual Retreat. Fees, Location, and Attendance is set up by a Guild committee. Spaces are limited. Details are provided in advance.

NEWSLETTER

An information packed newsletter is produced monthly – excluding July and August. This is the place to get all the Notes from the Executive, upcoming Program Activities, Community Involvement, Sew Days, and calendar dates. Member contributions are encouraged.

COMMUNITY QUILTS and OTHER PROJECTS

As a registered not for profit BC Society, we strive to provide comfort to Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows. The RMQG is very active in community service. Our membership generously donate their quilts and other items to:

a partnership with MR/PM Community Services. Our members donate all sizes of quilts. ie: Baby, Wheel Chair, Lap, Twin and up to Queen size hugs. MRPMCS in turn gift quilts to people in need via their in house programs, RCMP, EMS, Fire, and Alicia's Wish.

Meals on Wheels

Place mats are sent out with meals to new clients, and for special occasions. 100's are donated annually.

Stitched, stuffed and donated to the Cardiac Surgery Unit of Royal Columbian Hospital. A long standing member of the Guild was a nurse in the Cardiac Unit and has carried on this tradition for years.
